Abernethy Highland Games 11th August 2007; Report and results

Whilst the weather was not kind on Saturday, over 3000 spectators were treated to an excellent day of colour, music and action on the field. Paid admissions fell short of last year's numbers, but the quality of the competition and the enthusiasm of the spectators more than compensated.

The morning programme of children's fun events has gone from strength to strength, and attracted a large and vocal crowd of all ages, both participants and spectators, which contributed to the happy atmosphere of a rather grey, but dry, morning.

The opening parade saw the massed pipes and drums of six bands march on to the field followed by the members of the Clan Grant led by the Chief of Grant, Lord Strathspey. After an amusing, and inspiring address, partly delivered in Gaelic, Games Chieftain David Green OBE formally declared the Games open.

Seventy-six competitors took part in the track and field events. Numbers were up on last year, notably through the introduction of the inter village Tug o' War competition that proved a real highlight on the field.

The Nethy Bridge Trophy, awarded in the new Tug O'War competition, went to Carrbridge, in a well-fought contest between Nethybridge, Carrbridge, and Boat of Garten. The ladies of Grantown beat the "Nethy Numpties" although the latter won the £50 "best dressed" prize.

Nine competitors took part in the heavy events including local athlete Brian Harrold and top Scottish heavy Alistair Gunn, who swept the board in the open competition as well as taking home a special prize of a bottle of whisky for having successfully tossed Abernethy's extra heavy caber.

It's worth recording that in 2008 Abernethy Highland Games will be hosting the Scottish Heavy championships and this event is sure to attract even more notable competitors.

In the RSPB Abernethy Forest 10 Mile Race a good field of 75 runners participated, enduring quite difficult conditions, with wet & muddy tracks, resulting in rather slower times than last year. In the Team competition, however, Moray RR came in at 4 hr 12 min 25 sec, beating the Games Record of 4 hrs 23 min 58 sec set in 1998 by Nairn District AAC. Simon Pride of Forres Harriers, now a veteran, was first home once again, in a time of 55 min 28 sec.

On the Dancing stages, Gemma MacIver won all 4 categories in the 5 yrs Primary Class, and in the Premier Class, both Melissa Fife in the 9 yrs, and Katie Wright in the 11 yrs and under, made a clean sweep of all 6 dances. Best overseas competitor, Colleen McGregor followed her successes of the last 3 years by winning the 15 yrs Premier Class. Dancing numbers were well up; 78 dancers competed, reversing the downward trend of the past few years, and many compliments on a well-organised event were received from dancers and their families.

Piping numbers showed a substantial 27% increase on last year with Graham Wallace again taking the David Grant Blyth Cup for the most promising youngster. Hamish Munro of Llanbryde took the Gordon Cup, as overall winner of the Senior Competition.

Six bands participated in the spectacular parade of massed pipe bands, with 2622 Squadron RAAF Band from Lossiemouth taking home the Pipe Band Challenge Shield. The band very generously donated their prize money to local charity, the Badenoch & Strathspey Transport Co.

Chairman of Abernethy Highland Games Association Neil Sutherland commented after the Games "Our reputation as the Friendly Games is reinforced by the very positive feedback I've had from competitors and spectators alike who commented on the welcoming and happy atmosphere; the afternoon rain did not dampen the spirit of the day and a good time was had by all. This success was achieved thanks to the hard work of a great number of volunteers, local businesses and organisations from the community of Nethybridge and surrounding area."
