ABERNETHY HIGHLAND GAMES REPORT - 2011

Despite rain and flooding to the north and south, the sun shone on Nethy Bridge, with only a few light showers in the afternoon to cool the many enthusiastic athletes who participated in the various events.

Paid admissions topped the 3200 mark and around 3700 spectators in total enjoyed a spectacular days sport. 2 Scottish records were broken, again by youngster Kyle Randalls, beating his own Scottish record for Junior 44lb Weight over the Bar by 9", clearing 17'3" and setting a new record for the Scots Hammer.

In his opening speech, Games Chieftain Dennis Malcolm, Master Distiller and General Manager of the Glen Grant Distillery, commented on the close ties between his family and the Clan Grant; whilst not Grants, they have been involved with Glen Grant for many generations. After declaring the Games open, he was presented with an engraved crook as a souvenir of the day, by Games President, Neil Sutherland.

During Neil's President's address he paid tribute to two stalwarts of the Highland Games circuit, who sadly died during the year; Sandy Spence, who had judged our piping competition for many years, after a long career competing, and serving as Pipe Major of the Atholl Highlanders, and Kenny MacDonald, a longtime supporter of the Games both as a competitor and later as chief judge on the North of Scotland Amateur Highland Games circuit. Both will be greatly missed. He also applauded the work done by the charity Help for heroes, which the Games Association is proud to support.

The Massed Pipe Bands, following the opening ceremony, provided the most spectacular sight; no less than eight pipe bands, performed to a delighted crowd, parading 4 times round the field during the afternoon, with the Pipe Band Challenge Shield being won again by the Huntly and District Pipe Band. Banff Castle and District Pipe Band participated for the first time, hopefully the first of many appearances at Nethy.

New to the role of Convener of the kiddies fun events in the morning, John McCook proved more than able, and children, and their parents enjoyed a busy programme of races, with something for everybody Tattie and spoon races, the wheelbarrow race, 3 legged races and the obstacle course all attracted many entrants and great fun was had by all.

Particularly encouraging was the number of foreign families participating in the various events

The dancing entries were excellent this year, with 102 dancers, travelling from all over Scotland, Canada, Australia and England. The judges, Mandy Campbell from Grangemouth and Ian MacLean from Polmont commented on the incredible atmosphere, and the high standard of the dancing. The Fraser School won the Spey Vale Challenge Trophy once again as the most successful dancing school.

In the heavy events, 18 athletes competed in the three age categories. Two Scottish records were broken in the 17-19 junior heavy competition by Kyle Randalls. Kyle broke the records for Scots hammer and 44lb weight over the bar. Kyle also won the overall championship for this age category with Jamie Gunn in second place and David Coulthart in third. The overall competition for the 15-16 age category was won by Nethy Bridge heavy Conon Quinn with Calum McDonald in second and Aiden Finnie in third. The open heavy competition was won by Rusty Price from California, with Lauren Coulthart in second place and David Douson in third.

The Abernethy Tug of War Competition started at around 4pm in almost perfect conditions with the ground soft but not too wet, perfect for digging in the heels. 2 stalwart teams from Carrbridge were present again, the team representing the Cairn were led by Ian Grant, instrumental in the overall organisation, while the Rowanlea 8 were captained by Magnus O'Reilly. This year for the first time 2 Pipe Bands agreed to participate, Elgin and Dufftown, as long as the conditions were dry, they added. The first semi final was between Dufftown and Rowanlea. It was the hardest fought match of the competition and was eventually won by Dufftown. The second semi was between Cairn and Elgin. After a spirited effort by the Elgin team the match was won comfortably by Cairn. After a brief pause the pull off for 3rd and 4th position took place between Elgin and Rowanlea and was won by Rowanlea. The best of 3 Final followed quickly between Cairn and Dufftown. After a hard pull Cairn won the first round and the teams swapped ends. The second pull saw Cairn win again to become the Abernethy Games Tug of War Champions for the 4th consecutive year.

There was a strong field in the athletics competition. No records were broken but one was equalled.

On the piping boards, Norman Matheson making a welcome return to Nethy Bridge, together with his fellow Judge, Duncan Watson, commended the outstandingly high standard of piping, the competition being very close in all events. Anna Kimmerlow, from Germany, making her first appearance at The Games made a notable impact on the results. It was Niall Matheson though whose day was made by his formidable performances and wins in three of the four events. Judging the Junior events Jim Hamilton praised the exceptionally high level of entries and standard of playing. There were four players, at least, said Mr Hamilton, who could have competed at Senior level; indeed one already had at Ballater earlier in the season. Other competitors were most promising and were a credit to themselves and their teachers.

On the relatively new Drumming competition, Judge Alastair Dowling commented on the welcome increase in interest in this event. Thanks to Douglas Caldwell of the Elgin and District Pipe Band in particular, this year's entries were well intimated and the standard of solo playing higher, as might be expected. Abernethy Highland Games looks forward to more of the competing Pipe Bands following Elgin's fine example and putting forward solo drummers for next year's competition.

A total of 77 runners entered the RSPB Forest 10 mile race, with all completing the course. First home was 5. Mackenzie, of Forres Harriers in a time of 58.36. Probably the strongest run of the day was from Melissa White, Inverness Harriers, who came within a minute of the record despite wet and muddy conditions underfoot.

Scott Dixon retained the first local male title and Nethy Bridge resident Penny Lawson took the first local female prize for the first time.

The Team Prize went to Forres Harriers with a time of 4.37.12
