As the day drew closer all doubts about the weather disappeared and it became evident that the spectators and participants in the Abernethy Highland Games would again enjoy a magnificent day. Indeed they did, and although numbers were slightly down on last year (something going on down south?) well over 3000 visitors enjoyed a full programme of testing events. It was well after 6pm, under a still blue sky, when the last caber was tossed, winning both Bruce Robb and Jason Young, both newcomers to the Nethy Games, a bottle of Glen Grant whisky for having successfully thrown the mighty Nethy caber!

A contingent of youngsters from Bavaria, staying at Nethy House Hostel delighted the crowd when they marched round the field, after the Clan Grant, wearing their National costume. They were active participants in many of the events, and won the tug 'O' war, pulling against a team from Dufftown and District Pipe Band. In all, 7 pipe bands took part in the parades, and the Pipe Band Challenge Shield was won by Elgin and District Pipe band.

The programme of children's races in the morning drew a massive entry, and the number of heats and semi finals extended the event up to 1pm, just before the massed pipe bands made their first entry on to the field. Races involving parents were particularly popular with the three legged race and wheelbarrow races well contested, much to the amusement of the crowd. All competitors were delighted to be rewarded with a commemorative badge, as well as the usual sweeties and lollies, all kindly sponsored by Nethybridge Stores.

The crowd were relieved when, in his opening address, Games Chieftain, Jim McEwan, always ready with a humorous quip, confirmed that he had indeed picked up the right piece of paper, and it wasn't Sunday's sermon. Echoing Games President Neil Sutherland's sentiments, Jim, whilst modestly belittling his own part in the organisation, warmly praised the efforts of the entire community in mounting such an enjoyable and well organised event.

On the field, 23 heavies competed in the four events, and provided some great sporting entertainment. The open heavy competition was won by Bruce Robb from Fife, with Jason Young from Tain in second place and Kyle Randalls from Edinburgh, no longer competing as a junior, in third place. The strong field in the athletics competition saw two records broken by competitors from Inverness Harriers. Adam Hobson broke the 19 year and under 100yds race with a time of 10.6 seconds breaking the previous record set in 2010 (10.8), and Ian Coghill broke a long standing high jump record from 1990 (1.76) with a jump of 1.77m.

The 66 runners in the RSPB Abernethy Road Race enjoyed the glorious sunshine and the dappled shade provided by the scenic route through the Abernethy Forest and hamlets. Winner, Geraint Watkins of Forres Harriers led from gun to tape, however he was challenged all the way by 2nd placed Paul Miller, although the warm conditions meant that the course record of 50.56 was never threatened. A special mention is due to Walter Ryder from Cromarty in 83.00 the oldest competitor aged 74.

With so many of last year's junior pipers now competing in senior events the turnout for the junior piping events was this year lower than usual. At the same time there is the promise of a new and enthusiastic set of competitors for next year when a real contest between Badenoch and Strathspey and Elgin is likely. The judge, Jim Hamilton commended Scott Hay, now of Forres, in particular for his strong consistent playing and Sean McHugh of Elgin for his careful presentations.

The Highland Dancing drew a good entry, with 97 dancers competing in a very busy programme. The judges commented on the high standard of the dancing, and on the fantastic atmosphere of the games. Many dancers came from south of the border, and an Australian, Shannon Reinhard was a strong challenger to Duncan Slessor in the 17 yrs Premier group. Sinead Scobie from Glenrothes scooped the Overall Premier Dancer title and the Elsie Ross Trophy, as well as the Abernethy Games Trophy, and the Clan Grant Society Cup.

The trade stands surrounding the field this year were particularly attractive; as well as the usual tartans, T shirts and toys, locally hand crafted Harris tweed accessories, locally grown plants, stunning and reasonably priced jewellery, there was a wide variety of interesting items on offer The many stallholders loved the glorious weather, and the interaction with the enthusiastic crowd, who were all bent on enjoying themselves, wandering round or sitting back in the sunshine, cheering on the athletes.

Altogether a grand day for everyone, athletes and visitors alike!
